

Double Jeopardy Instructions

(to be used with the Jeopardy powerpoint resource)

Type in the 6 different topics you want to test the students on in the “subject” slides

Decide how you want to play the game. There are two options:

Option 1: the students tell you the questions to the “answers” you have written, or

Option 2: the students give answers to the questions you have written

This powerpoint is set up for option 1:

- type in the answers

- when you click on a money value, the answer will appear. The students have to give you a relevant question.

To use this powerpoint for Option 2:

- where it says “type in answer”, you need to type in a question, and vice versa.

- when you click on a money value in the main board area, the question will appear. The students have to give you the correct answer.

The higher value boxes on the main board area, should have the more difficult questions/ words associated with them.

If the answer is correct, the value of that square is added to their score.

If the answer is incorrect, the double of the value of the square is removed from their score (you decide if you want to allow them to go into minus numbers)

The team with the most points, wins.

Keeping Score

You can set up an Excel worksheet to keep a sum total of all the pluses and minuses that accumulate for each team.

Instructions for Students

Choose a square. The higher the money, the more difficult the question you have to answer.

If you answer correctly, your team gets that number of points.

If incorrectly, your team gets double that number of points removed.
